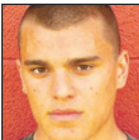

- One of the area's premiere sprinters, won the Class 3A state title in the 500-meter dash and ran a leg for the Titans' 1,600 relay team, which claimed a state title.
- His winning time in the 500 at the state meet was 1:07.25, which gave him a dramatic victory over Westlake's Deandre Robinson by less than a second.
- Won county title in the 300 dash.

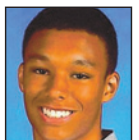

■ Placed fourth in Class 2A in the 1,600 after winning county title.



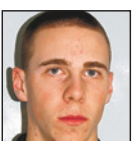
